



Certificates regarding COVID-19 that are accepted at the border in Iceland

Current rules require all travellers arriving in Iceland from high-risk areas for COVID-19 to undergo 14 days of quarantine or choose screening for COVID-19 at the border.

From 19 August screening entails a test at the border ([PCR-test](#)) and another test 5 days later if the first test is negative. Until results of the second test are received rules of quarantine need to be adhered to. If the second test is negative then quarantine is lifted.

The following certificates are accepted upon arrival in Iceland for exemption of testing and quarantine:

- An Icelandic certificate of prior COVID-19 infection in Iceland with isolation concluded, based on presumed immunity for SARS-CoV-2. The certificate needs to be issued by a licensed physician or the Directorate of Health In Iceland.
- An Icelandic certificate of the presence of antibodies against SARS-CoV-2 measured in Iceland, based on the same principle as above. The certificate needs to be issued by a licensed physician or the Directorate of Health in Iceland.
